Laureate of the Nuremberg Academy's Research Prize



Aude Brejon was awarded a Ph.D. in public international law by the University of Paris II Panthéon Assas. Her thesis focused on prosecutors in international criminal courts. This unprecedented work provided a comparative analysis of the statutory standards applying to prosecutors, thus highlighting the complexity of transposing domestic criminal standards into the international arena.

Aude Brejon is now co-director of the *revue Droits fondamentaux* and member of the editorial committee of the *Annuaire français de justice transitionnelle*. She continues her research in international criminal law, international law and international human rights law in various research centres.

During the résidences Adamas, Aude Brejon will work on her new research project related to the after-trial in international criminal justice. In light of the limited harmonization in the implementation of international criminal courts' decisions at the domestic level, a study of the after-trial is necessary to ensure that international criminal justice meets its two objectives: punishment and rehabilitation.
