"Rethinking Peace through Justice. 10 Years Nuremberg Academy"

Located at the historic site of the Nuremberg trials, the International Nuremberg Principles Academy aims to contribute to the understanding and enforcement of international criminal law. To this end, the Academy conducts applied research, strengthens capacities, and facilitates public discourse.

As part of its efforts to foster public discourse also outside the specialist community, the Academy is organising an open day on the occasion of its 10th anniversary. The event's aim is to make international criminal law and the Academy's work accessible to a wider public while encouraging public engagement on both.

The event will mainly take place in German, especially the discussions in Courtroom 600. Individual programme items taking place in the Academy's premises will be held in English. Admission is free and includes a visit to the Memorium Nuremberg Trials.
